City of Springfield: Repair & Enhance Buddy McLemore Recreational Park

Purpose: Repair and significant improvements to Buddy McLemore Park

This project will include the following major components:

- Repair and upgrade concession stand, including covered seating area, restroom, and locker rooms.
- Reposition and repair football field.
- Replace bleachers.
- Replace perimeter fencing throughout the park.
- Replace interior fencing to segment specific areas, i.e., football field, basketball courts, and tennis courts.
- Repair and resurface basketball and tennis courts.
- Create a community space for indoor sports events.
- Create playground with sunshades.
- Enhance parking.
- Create required stormwater basins.

Buddy McLemore Recreational Park is located on East 3rd Street in Springfield, Florida. The property consists of 9.172 acres of city land, which previously included the Springfield Fire Department and a community football field, concession stand, bleachers, community center, and basketball courts. Hurricane Michael ravaged the area on October 10, 2018, decimating the park and all its components. The City of Springfield's long-term plans are to relocate the Fire Department to a consolidated city complex and, through this request, revamp the primary recreational park in the City—Buddy McLemore Park.

The City plans to move the Fire Department, opening a large portion of land that will allow the park improvements without investing in the acquisition of large parcels of land. This park is in Census tract 10, block group 1, with an LMI population of 67.36%. The current condition of this property is heavily damaged. Even now more than two years after the disaster, little work has been completed on this facility due to the City's overwhelming damage. Overall, the City has been forced to prioritize resources and their strained financial condition has not allowed for any work on this important park. Because this park serves the entire community (including surrounding areas), its revitalization is critical to the community's full recovery.

This project will repair the concession stand facility to include ADA equipped restrooms, locker rooms for athletic teams, and covered outdoor areas for picnicking and gatherings. They will reposition the football field to accommodate an identified parking lot, playground, and stormwater basin not currently existing at this location. The addition of an indoor community center for gatherings and indoor sports events will give the City an indoor space and a venue that could generate a small revenue. The City will also repair, resurface, and expand the basketball and tennis courts to accommodate the community needs. The upgrades and repairs to this city park are paramount in the City's recovery. Although the City has been faced with difficult decisions about spending the funds made available through Hurricane related programs, there has been a considerable push for city parks to be rehabbed and improved so the residents can establish a sense of normalcy.


Buddy McLemore Park Site Location
