ORDINANCE NO. 515

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO SHELTERS FOR HOMELESS PERSONS; EXTENDING THE MORATORIUM ON THE PROCESSING OF PERMITS FOR THE OPERATION OF "HOMELESS SHELTERS" DEVELOPMENT OF STRUCTURES TO SERVE "HOMELESS SHELTERS" IN THE CORPORATE BOUNDARIES OF SPRINGFIELD FOR THE SHORTER OF (1) SIX MONTHS OR (2) OF A REPLACEMENT ORDINANCE; **ENACTMENT FOR** SEVERABILITY; REPEALING **PROVIDING** ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VIII, Section 2 of the Florida Constitant Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, the City of Springfield, Florida (here "City") is authorized to protect the public health, safety, and welfare residents and has the power and the authority to enact ordinance regulations for valid governmental purposes that are not inconsistent general or special law; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission seeks to preserve the public community tranquility, health, safety and general welfare of all citizens of thand

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds and determines that the Ci adopted Land Development Regulations in order to implement its Compreh Plan, and to comply with the requirements of the laws of State of Florida, inc the regulation of land use within the City for the purpose of establishing ho shelters in conjunction with the development of land; and

WHEREAS, in order to carry out the purposes of the Florida Statutes a purposes of the City's Land Development Regulations, the City Commission and determines that the City's Land Development Regulations should be more to regulate homeless shelters, including designating restricted or prohibited to well as the proper procedures for application, review, permitting, locatic financial support for such homeless shelters; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined the need to addr City's Land Development Regulations relative to homeless shelters, and wi ensure that the City's Land Development Regulations as they relate to a ho shelter are in compliance with all constitutional and other legal requirement

WHEREAS, while staff is analyzing and preparing applicable ord amendments, in order to prevent the occurrence of uses which m incompatible with the intent of this Ordinance during the evaluation periodity Commission has determined that a temporary moratorium on the but or opening of homeless shelters will allow for a future process to perroperation and use of homeless shelters that desire to be located in the City.

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Springfield to the moratorium established by Ordinance 512 for up to an additional months.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CI SPRINGFIELD IN BAY CITY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Recitals.

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and are found to correct.

Section 2. Definitions.

For the purpose of this Ordinance, a "homeless shelter" or "shelter" n facility intended to provide temporary housing to people in need and without Shelters created for disaster response and relief are excluded from this Ordin

Section 3. Temporary Moratorium Declared.

The City of Springfield hereby extends the moratorium establisl Ordinance 512, commencing on the effective date of this Ordinance, on ar development approvals for homeless shelters within all of the City for the sh an additional (1) six months or (2) enactment of a new ordinance by the city.

The City Commission may extend this moratorium by ordinance if it r legislative determination that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Springl do so.

Section 4. Additional Regulations.

During the temporary moratorium imposed, staff shall review, research make recommendations to the Local Planning Agency and the City Commegarding consideration for either a regulatory ordinance or for additional development regulations and operational use permits related to homeless sl. Such recommendation shall consider, but not be limited to, the following considerations:

- A. Prohibiting of new homeless shelters in certain corridors of the City;
- B. Creation of supplementary regulations for homeless shelters Land Development Regulations;
- C. Creation of operational regulations and minimal opera standards for homeless shelters in the Springfield Code of Ordinances;
- D. Other issues relating to homeless shelters that become apply during staff's analysis of the effects and potential effects of homeless shelt the City of Springfield, Bay County or comparable communities.

Section 5. Applicability.

This Ordinance and the City's authority to regulate homeless sl pursuant hereto shall be applicable throughout the City.

Section 6. Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable; and if any se subsection, sentence, clause or provision is held invalid by any court of comjurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall not be af thereby.

Section 7. Repealer.

All ordinances, resolution or parts thereof, including but not limited to Chapter 27900, Laws of Florida (1951), as amended (which became a City ordinance pursuant to and upon enactment of Section 166.021(5), Florida Statutes), which are inconsistent or in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and of no further force and effect.

Section 8. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption by the City Commission.
