ticipation in such program.

Gentlemen:

Over the last several months the Department of Pollution Control has been conducting public hearings on the priority list for FY 75 funds and Bay County has been approved for funding for a Step 1 grant to prepare a basic engineering study of the area's needs. This is known as a 201 facility plan.

Under the Federal guidelines the planning area for each city should include the areas where sewer service is most likely to be needed over the next few years. Attached is a copy of a proposed planning boundary for Bay County, which

includes Panama City, Panama City Beach, Lynn Haven, Springfield, Callaway, Cedar Grove, Parker and unincorporated areas of Bay County. Before the State can certify the grant application to EPA, we must obtain from each affected governmental body, a written statement specifying:


- (1) Each respective governmental body's agreement on the planning area,*
- (2) The body to serve as the lead applicant.

A suggested way for doing this is by obtaining representation from each of the governing bodies and jointly reviewing the planning boundary, which, through your knowledge of the local area, may provide recommendations for modifying the boundary. Further, it is advisable that agreement be reached between each of the governing bodies as to how to split the 25% local share, 75% being borne by the Federal Government.

The consulting engineering firms of J. B. Converse and Flood & Associates have been provided current details of the nature of the program. They are required to prepare a plan of study for meeting the study objectives together with a detailed cost estimate. This plan has been expanded over what we understood it to be even a few months ago, and this new cost estimate is needed to insure that adequate funds are budgeted by the State and EPA. It will identify more precisely the local share that should be divided among the local governments.

I will be available to meet with you on a mutually acceptable meeting date to answer any questions you have on the program. If you will call me and suggest a meeting date, and if my schedule permits, I will be there to amplify any aspects of the program you need. You may call me at 932-5323. Attached is a copy of a draft resolution that you can use to indicate your support of the planning area and of identifying the lead applicant.

*NOTE: Panama City Beach has provided a resolution agreeing to support Bay County as applicant. Panama City Beach needs only to document agreement with planning boundary.
