RESOLUTION NO.: 95-1

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THAT PERSONS QUALIFYING AS CITY OF SPRINGFIELD RESERVE POLICE OFFICERS SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR ENROLLMENT INTO THE FLORIDA STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield has implemented a Reserve Police Officer program whereby certified law enforcement persons volunteer their services to the City; and


WHEREAS, the Reserve Police Officers are not regular employees of the City of Springfield, and are not eligible for enrollment in the Florida State Retirement System;

WHEREAS, in the event that a Reserve Officer works as a volunteer for the City more than 32 hours in a month, then he or she shall be paid \$7.50 per hour for hours worked in excess of the 32 hours during that same month.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Commissioners of the City of Springfield, that Reserve Police Officers that volunteers to work more than 32 hours in a month, shall receive \$7.50 per hour for all hours in excess of the 32 hours during the same month. The Reserve Police Officer position is not eligible for enrollment in the Florida State Retirement System.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
